Mission Statement

We have a commitment to you as an extension of your family in partnering in developing happy, healthy, well-balanced and educated children. With our hands on approach to learning, we believe each child is an individual and we strive to challenge, inspire and develop each child to his/her fullest potential.

Introduction

Welcome!!! This handbook is designed to better acquaint you with our school as well as provide a better insight into our education philosophies and goals.

Our Philosophy

We understand the complexities when choosing the best school for your child/children. We thank-you for choosing Moosey's Adventures in Learning and are confident that you and your child/children will realize that we are the right choice as your partner in education. Our Philosophy at" Moosey's Adventures in

Learning is to focus on the "whole child" realizing that each child grows individually at his/her own pace through the five areas of development which are:

- Emotional
- Social
- Spiritual
- Academic
- Physical

We believe that a child's attitude and view of self are key factors in their learning experience. Providing a positive and encouraging learning environment accompanied by structure, loving guidance and discipline will help our students to develop a healthy sense of self and achieve their fullest potential.

Our Goals

We strive to provide a nurturing, loving, safe, calm yet stimulating environment for the children. Teachers use a quiet/low tone/voice level when speaking with children. We help teach and encourage children to respect the learning environment of their peers as well. We ask parents to do the same when entering and exiting the school. Talking on cell phones is **NOT** permitted on campus. Thank you for being respectful. Dropping off and/or picking up are valuable moments for your child. Being 100% available is most helpful to teachers and is so rewarding for your child!

Curriculum

Moosey's Adventures in Learning proudly uses *The Creative Curriculum*.

What is *The Creative Curriculum*?

The philosophy of *The Creative Curriculum* is that young children learn best by doing. This curriculum is built on theories of development in young children such as: all children learn through active exploration of their environment; and therefore

the environment plays a critical role in learning. The goal of *The Creative Curriculum* is to help children become independent, self-confident, inquisitive and enthusiastic learners through active exploration of their environment.

The curriculum identifies goals in all areas of development: social/emotional, cognitive, physical, and language. The planned activities for the children, organization of the environment, the selection of toys and materials, planning of the daily schedule and the interactions the children have are all designed to accomplish the goals and objectives of the curriculum and providing your child with the tools for a successful school year.

Our team at Moosey's Adventures in Learning encourages learning through rich cross-curricular activities in literacy, math, science, social studies, the arts, and technology. Our team uses a wide range of teaching strategies from child-initiated learning to teacher-directed approaches, to best respond to the individual learning styles, as well as strengths and interests of the children.

Our Moosey's Adventures in Learning team carefully build the curriculum for our children while focusing on 12 different areas of interest.

1. **Dramatic Play/Practical Life:** Teaching your child via the world of pretend; self-identifications, family, community, and learning to care for, feed, clean and practice real life skills.
2. **Blocks/Construction and Design:** Teaching your child about shape, dimension/size, construction balance, and cooperation.
3. **Manipulative/Table Materials:** is all about a free choice of a variety of materials available to use with a larger social seating area.
4. **Creative Art:** Teaching your child creativity with textures, color, and design. Creative art allows children to develop fine motor skills.
5. **Sand and Water:** Exploring through sand and water; textures, measuring and much more.
6. **Library/Cozy Area:** Teaching your child about free choice based on his/her individual interests through books, puppetry and flannel board stories. Independent beginning reading skills (left to right), as well as associating pictures with words while encouraging exploration and the development of one's imagination.
7. **Music and Movement:** Teaching your child to experience creativity through patterns and melody while building gross-motor skills.

8. **Math and Science:** Teaching your child the important role they play in the conservation of our Earth. This is accomplished by helping them understand their role/relationship concerning nature (recycling, planting, etc.). We incorporate the very crucial interest area "math" through this center. Sorting, classifying, matching, counting, measuring, subtraction, addition, numbers, order, and much more.
9. **Writing Center: Literacy/Beginning Writing Skills:** is all about experiences that excite the children to copy, create, and explore writing and the world of printed words that will eventual advance with excitement to independently attempt to beginning writing on their own.
10. **Computer/Listening Station:** We offer a computer station with educational fun games on tablets for children to use for limited computer time.
11. **Gross-Motor Skills:** Developing your child's physical fitness and allowing for free time to develop social skills and positive interactions with their friends. These activities are held both outside and in our indoor play area.
12. **Cooking:** The richer the environments the more concrete opportunities there are for children to learn by interacting with materials and their peers. Our role is to create an environment that invites children to observe, to be actively engaged, to make their own choices, and to experiment.

Pre-K

Not only do we stimulate the minds and bodies of our Pre-K/VPK students, we also broaden their horizons with educational field trips. You will be notified in advance and additional fees will apply for participation. As always, **VOLUNTEERS ARE WELCOME.**

Orientation, Registration, and Enrollment Two-Week Exit Process

Orientation: Orientation consists of meeting with your child and the family. During this meeting a tour of our campus will be given along with the review of the policies, procedures, and expectations set forth by Moosey's Adventures in Learning will be reviewed and discussed. Two Separate meetings may be requested; one involving the entire family, and one focused on just the parents.

Children and families are conditionally accepted to Moosey's Adventures in Learning, subject to a trial period (approximately two weeks) to establish their capacity to benefit from our program. Our Preschool Directors reserve the right to make adjustments and/or recommendations that would best serve the interests of all the children. Families with children that have an IEP must present a copy for review. Some IEPs require a smaller ratio for your child.😊

A non-refundable registration fee is collected at the time of registration and the first week in September thereafter.

There are several forms required to be completed/acquired prior to your child's first day. Please allow yourself enough time to complete the necessary documents.😊

Student Withdrawal Process

If for whatever reasons you should need to terminate your child's/children's enrollment with Moosey's Adventures in Learning, we ask that you notify the office in writing with a two-week notice. We have created a family environment where teachers and children build relationships. Saying goodbye is always an emotional for all those involved. We will use the two weeks to make this a smooth transition for you and your child. Please note: You are financially responsible for the tuition for the "two-week notice" regardless of your child's attendance.

School Hours/Arrival & Dismissal Procedures

Drop off and pick up attendance books are located in the office. Everyone is required to go through the office prior to drop-off and prior to pick-up in-order to sign the attendance books. Failure to sign your child in or out will result in a \$15 fee for each missing entry. Please remember that law requires signing these logs. We ask that you exit and enter through the same classroom door.

We are open from **7:15am** to **5:30pm** for your convenience. Drop-off period is between 7:15 and 9:30 am. Pick-up period is between 3:00-5:30pm.

We do not recommend that a child's daily schedule in school to exceed more than 10 hours on a daily basis. We believe that children need to have a healthy balance between family time and school. We do recommend a 6-8 hour schedule for students but also understand the need for our working families.

All students must be settled in class no later than 9:30am. We highly respect the education of our children and cannot compromise it by allowing distractions and disruptions after 9:30am. Please make other arrangements for your child if you are unable to have your child settled into class by 9:30am. Please Note: Parents need to be out of the classroom by 9:30am as academics and our school day begins.

Please be sure to sign your child in and out every day with a legible signature consisting of your first and last name along with the time. This is a school policy as well as a requirement by our governing agencies. Fees incurred by governing agencies that fail to properly sign in and out daily for all age groups along with VPK short/long forms, will be passed on to families. Please see the attached list of events and holidays.

Separation Anxiety/Transitions

Sometimes children and parents suffer from separation anxiety when the children enter school. In this case, a calm, pleasant, and prompt exit on the part of the parent will be most helpful as you leave your child in the care of a reassuring staff member. Lengthy good-byes

Attendance

Each day in Preschool is a unique learning experience that cannot be recaptured. Regular, timely attendance is essential to the educational growth of your child. Excessive absences may result in your child not being able to adjust to his/her

teachers, peers, and classroom routines. Please note: If a child is absent from school, parents are required to give a courtesy call by 9:30am to report the absence.

Holiday Closings/Early Release Days

We are closed and observe the following holidays:

Labor Day, Thanksgiving (day of and the day after), Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, Winter Break (the week between Christmas and New Year's Day), Memorial Day, and Independence Day.

VPK: VPK holidays are different from our regular school calendar. The VPK voucher pays for 540 hours. Our VPK students follow the "school board" for closings, which completes the 540 hours. We do offer an optional extended education that's includes tuition fees and an additional registration fee.

Please note: Full tuition is required for these days off with no exception to "winter break." Your tuition for the year is pro-rated for the week off between Christmas and New Year's Day. The staff at Moosey's Adventures in Learning works hard as an extension of your family, although we do value these designated closings for our personal family time too 😊.

Emergency Closings

Moosey's Adventures in Learning will close in conjunction with the Palm Beach County School System when we are faced with inclement weather or a hurricane warning. In the event that we do have to close, we will reopen as soon as it is safe enough to do so. Please contact the office to stay informed of our reopening date/time. If we are faced with an emergency closing or early closing due to other unforeseen reasons, we will contact you by phone. A need to close would be in the extreme event such as a broken water pipeline etc. Tuition credits are not given for emergency closings.

Emergency Plans and Procedures

Lightning/Thunder: Children will be brought in from the playground immediately. Children on a field trip will be taken indoors or into the school vans. Teachers will keep attendance clipboards with them at all times and conduct routine headcounts/role calls.

Tornado: All children will be brought into the main classroom and will be instructed to sit on the floor near the interior wall, with their heads tucked into their knees. Calming songs and soothing conversations will be used to keep children as calm as possible. Parents will be called when it is safe to do so. Attendance will be taken and all students will be accounted for at all times. *** Children on a field trip will be taken to the safest and closest locations and the school will be contacted immediately to discuss the location and safety of the children.

Hurricane: In the event of an impending hurricane, Moosey's Adventures in Learning will be closed. If for some reason the school is open, all students will meet in the main classroom and will be instructed to sit on the floor near the interior wall, with their heads tucked into their knees. Calming songs and soothing conversations will be used to keep children as calm as possible. Parents will be called when it is safe to do so. Attendance will be taken and all students will be accounted for at all times. *** Children on a field trip will be taken to the safest and closest locations and the school will be contacted immediately to discuss the location and safety of the children.

Fire: In the event of a fire (NOT A DRILL), all teachers will take their students out of the building through the safest, closest exit. Every child will be accounted for. Students will be escorted off our campus, across the Red Barn Plaza, and meet at the fence located furthest west. Students will line up along the fence and attendance will be taken.

Lock Down: In the event of a threatening stranger or event located on our campus or within a close proximity to our campus, all students will be brought inside. All doors to our facility will be locked, blinds will be closed, and lights will be turned off. All children will be in the main classroom with all staff members. Attendance will be taken and all students will be accounted for. We will sit quietly on the floor until it is safe to resume school or send the students home; whichever is advised by the police/sheriff's department.

Emergency closings due to loss of water or electricity: In this event, we will allow for our local agencies to respond. If any unforeseen events of this nature occur that are not appropriate practices for the safety and health of the children, parents will be notified for pick up.

Tuition/Fees

Tuition is due on the 1st and 15th of each month. A credit card or voided check must be on file.

Please note: even though circumstances arise; please understand that we cannot make special favors or adjustments to late fees. As in all businesses, we too have bills/creditors that expect payments on time and are given late fees. The school upholds a budget, including the salaries of our wonderful staff, based on your tuition payments being made on time.

Declines, Returned Check fees, and Late Pick Up

If your child is picked up after his/her scheduled program time, a late fee of \$15 is calculated for any part of the first 5 minutes (1-5 minutes late). A fee of an additional \$1.00 per minute will accumulate thereafter. Habitual late pick up may result in the termination of your child's enrollment.

Our goal is to have all students picked up on time in respect to the official closing time and to respect the personal agendas/family life of our staff members. Please be on time!

Illness Policy

For the protection of the children, teachers and families, we reserve the right to refuse the acceptance of any child that we feel shows signs of illness. If a child becomes ill during the day, he/she will be brought to the office for parent pick up. It is your responsibility to have alternate arrangements if you are unable to pick up immediately.

Please understand that we are a learning facility. If a child does not feel well, it is highly unlikely that he/she will have a productive day.

Please note: Certain medications only mask the symptoms. Germs/viruses are still being spread if your child is ill.

**Please note: Any child sent home for an illness, must remain home for a minimum of one school day. We may require a doctor's note to return to school depending on the symptoms/illness of the child. We reserve the right to make our own judgment

call, even after receiving a doctor's note. The following situations will require your child to be sent home:

1. A temperature of 100 degrees or higher
2. An unexplained rash
3. Strong/thick discharge from the nose/eyes.
4. Diarrhea
5. Any contagious infection (please see communicable diseases).

***Full tuition is due even while a child is out sick. We cannot credit an account due to illness. Your tuition reserves your child's spot even if he or she is not attending.

Medications and Non-Medical Physical Barriers Policy

We apologize for any inconveniences but we do not administer any form of medications. The staff at Moosey's Adventures in Learning cannot administer sunscreen, bug repellent, etc. We suggest that you apply sunscreen prior to dropping your child off at school when necessary.

Asthmatic children needing nebulizer treatments: a family member or other parent-designated individual may come to the school and administer the treatment as needed. Please be sure to check with the office for clearance and to set up a schedule. We will require a written and signed schedule that allows permission by you, the parent, allowing a designated individual to administer the treatments.

Incidents/Accidents

Despite all the precautions we take to prevent incidents and/or accidents, they may still happen. In these circumstances, the parents of the children involved will be notified.

In the event that a serious injury or medical emergency occurs, 911 will be dialed immediately so that the necessary treatment can be administered for the care and protection of the child. Parents will be notified as soon as the proper actions are

taken to insure the child receives proper medical treatment. Authorization for emergency medical care is given at the time of enrollment.

*Please note: we make every effort to report any/all minor incidents/accidents that occur; although there are times some minor incidents/accidents may be missed or not reported to the staff by the child.

**If you should have a concern regarding an incident that was not reported to you by a member of our staff, please call the office immediately and share your concern(s). Please provide a written statement of your concern(s) to the office by the next school day so that we may investigate your concern and report back to you in a timely manner.

When and if an accident/incident occurs:

- You will receive a report of the incident signed by a staff member.
- A parent must sign the report that day in the office.
- The report will be placed in the student's file

**Please note: although we have at least one staff member certified in children's first aid and CPR on campus at all times, we are limited by law to the extent of "treatment" we may administer.

Summer Dress Code

Students may wear regular play clothes throughout the summer. Every Friday during the summer we have a fun water day! Please be sure to pack a bag with the following "water day" items:

- Bathing suit
- Towel
- Water proof pull-ups (if potty training)
- Swim shoes
- Change of clothes and shoes

Please be sure to label everything. Please remember to apply sunscreen before bringing your child to school!

Lost and Found

Any personal item left at the school that is not labeled with a name will be placed in the lost and found located in the office. The lost and found will be emptied at the end of the month. All suitable items will be donated to a local charitable organization.

Objects from Home

Toys or any other items from home are to be brought to school only on a designated day, for example show and tell days. Please be sure to label any items brought to school with your child's name. It is the responsibility of the parent to enforce this with his/her child prior to coming to school. Please do not begin the process of taking away toys/items on campus.

Discipline Policy

Discipline is a vital part of the learning process of a child. Discipline is a means of teaching, guiding, and training. When boundaries and expectations are clearly defined, children feel secure. Clearly setting rules and communicating expectations help to avoid misbehaviors while promoting self-discipline and self-control.

Discipline and structure begin in the home first. A child that does not already have this foundation established amongst primary care givers/parents in his/her home setting may have a difficult time adjusting in their school environment.

Positive methods such as redirection, explanations, words of praise, modeling, and other methods are our first choice for discipline at Moosey's Adventures in Learning. Discipline will be administered with an appropriate mixture of kindness and firmness; in a manner that respects the feeling, developmental needs, emotional needs, and daily needs of the child.

Please Note:

The following is a guideline for your child's discipline schedule:

1. Positive redirection with a loving and compassionate approach.
2. Removal from the class. At this time, we will talk one on one using a kind and loving approach in an effort to expose the root of the behavior.
3. Parent phone call for immediate pick up.
4. Time off. The school may require this. Time off is an opportunity for families to spend valuable time together to reinforce behaviors and helping the child get back on track.

For more extreme behavior and/or consistent disrespectful behavior such as:

- Not being respectful to staff or children
- Not following directions
- Biting, kicking, fighting, cursing, spitting, hitting, etc.
- Damaging school property or the personal property of others

Such actions as those listed above, and similar behaviors, may result in the child's immediate termination from our program. Behaviors such as these hinder our ability to maintain a safe and healthy learning environment for ALL children enrolled at Moosey's Adventures in Learning.

*** Please Note: We still reserve the right to terminate any child for such behaviors mentioned.

Biting Policy

We want to ensure that every child is safe while in our care. Our program provides an environment that encourages and promotes cooperative interactions with others. These interactions allow for children to develop respect for others, find ways to practice non-aggressive problem solving, and other social skills. Biting is a normal stage of development for young children who are teething and/or are still developing their language skills. Biting is usually a temporary condition that is most commonly seen in children between the ages of thirteen and twenty-four months of age.

For safety and health reasons, we take biting very seriously. When there is a biting incident, it can be very scary, frustrating and stressful for all those involved. Biting is not something that should be blamed on children, parents, or teachers; and there are no quick fix solutions.

Children bite for a variety of reasons: simple sensory exploration, panic, crowding, attention seeking behaviors, intense desire for an object, etc. Repeated biting becomes a pattern of learned behavior that may become difficult to extinguish due to the proven productivity of the behavior. Children in this age group do not have the understanding that biting hurts another person. Our teachers plan activities carefully in order to avoid biting as much as possible. Unfortunately, there are times when everyone cannot be within immediate reach to prevent a bite.

Our policy for handling a biting incident is as follows:

1. The biter is immediately removed from the group with a firm "you may not hurt your friend." "Our teeth are for eating, not to hurt." The victim of the bite is consoled and the bite is washed with anti-bacterial soap and water. An icepack is applied when needed to reduce swelling/bruising. The biter is not allowed to return to play and is spoken to on a level that he/she can understand. The child is redirected back into the environment.
2. A courtesy call will be made and a written incident report will be ready at pick up for parents of all children involved. The name of a biting child is not released, as it serves no purpose and may make difficult situations more complicated.
3. The context of each biting incident is examined for a pattern or similarity that may help to prevent additional incidents.
4. We work with each biting child on resolving conflict or frustration in an appropriate manner.
5. We try to adapt the environment whenever possible in order to reduce stress for the child.
6. We make special efforts to protect potential victims.

Moosey's Adventures in Learning's staff makes every possible effort to correct the behavior quickly; balancing our commitment to all parties involved. The "biter" may be sent home each day if the behavior continues to add stress and effect the

learning environment of all the students. We will continue to do so for as long as needed. If we begin to feel that we have made every effort to make the program work for the biting child, we will consider asking a family to withdraw the child until he/she outgrows this phase.

What We Expect from Children and Parents

We expect that all children and families will respect all rules and procedures addressed in this handbook, as well as those outlined in your parent's package. Along with the rules and procedures, we need to each respect the rights of the other children, families and staff, as well as the school grounds. We require ongoing communication and commitment in building a relationship with your child's teachers and directors. Your child's teachers and mentors will set the example and remind you that this is a partnership between your family and the staff at Moosey's Adventures in Learning. Our staff, students, and families deserve the right to enjoy and thrive every day at Moosey's Adventures in Learning.

There is a no tolerance policy for destructive or hurtful gossip amongst families towards the school, staff, directors, or owner. We encourage setting up a meeting or phoning conference for ANY concerns. We are always willing to share and have open communication! We will happily answer any questions you have!

Snacks/Meals

***Please note: we have prayer before each snack/meal.

Parents will provide lunch and snacks:

We strongly believe in nutritious foods to help children function at their best each day; and to promote "healthy living." If your child is caught up in the "sugar snack" "fast food" craze, please feel free to pick up a sample menu of "healthy me," located in the office.

Birthdays

Birthdays are a special occasion for young children and worthy of celebration! If you would like to celebrate your child's birthday at school, please make arrangements ahead of time with your child's teacher. You are invited to bring a birthday snack for your child's classmates and teachers. We ask that birthday

invitations be only passed out at school if all the children are invited. This policy is to avoid "hurt feelings."

Naptime

Each child will be provided with a vinyl mat that will be bleached weekly, or as needed. Parents will be required to provide two small blankets, one for lying on and one to cover up with. Blankets must be taken home every Friday to be laundered and returned on Monday. Please be sure to label these items. You may refer to your child's individual schedule for naptime. Children are not required to sleep, but they do need to have a quiet rest time and respect those who are napping.

Please note: we cannot withhold a child from napping by parent request. We do have the periodic child that does not sleep. We will provide books or quiet activities for them after the children requiring rest have fallen asleep.

Daily Schedules

Your child's daily schedule is posted in his/her classroom. A copy of the schedule is included in your registration packet. Please be sure to review it for designated days: show and tell, bible study, book day, sign language, Spanish, etc.

Communication

Each child will receive a daily report in his/her notebook/folder. Notebooks remain in your child's cubby. Please be sure to read and sign off that you have done so. We also encourage parents to communicate/write notes back in your child's notebook. We will do our best to let you know when any items need to be replenished although it is ultimately the responsibility of the parent to have all the items readily available each day.

Please Note: we will be unable to accept children if items needed are not available.

Newsletters: We post and send home newsletters each month to provide you with the most recent news and events!

Weekly Curriculum: We post the weekly curriculum on each class parent board along with copies available in the office to take home. Please discuss curriculum and ask your child questions on a daily basis!

Parent Conference/Progress Reports: We provide parent conferences three times a year that educate and update you on your child's development. We reserve the right to require "as needed" conferences. Conferences are a time when we can inform you about your child's academic growth gained from developmental screenings, assessments, and portfolio work accumulated throughout the year.

***Please note: developmental screenings are done yearly on the child's birthday or $\frac{1}{2}$ birthday. Referrals are completed by Moosey's Adventure's in Learning.

Open House: We provide an open house each year prior to the upcoming school year. This event will give you information for the new school year!

In Addition:

We offer classes for families: positive discipline, play activities that will build relationships with children, First Aid and CPR, and many more topics based on the desire and needs of our families' input. Licensed therapists and/or nurses lead these classes from the Early Childhood Wellness program we partner with.

Family Resources: We offer a variety of books, parenting magazines, community events, and information sheets on a variety of topics that are useful to our families. You can find these resources in our office.

Open Door Policy

Parents are welcome to inquire about their child's day at any point or observe your child in his/her classroom from a designated area. Please feel free to contact us at any time and remember we strongly value parent participation.

Field Trips

Permission for any field trip is given at the time of enrollment on the registration form. Advanced notice will be given prior to each field trip including date, time, meal plans, destination and cost. Parents will need to sign a permission slip for each individual trip. We strongly encourage parents to volunteer when possible. Field Trips are a great way to spend time with your child and learn more about his/her friends and teachers ☺.

Parent Volunteers

Volunteering is a great way to stay involved in your child's education while staying connected to your child's school family. If you have time or a special skill that you could share, please let your child's teacher know, along with a written note to the office to request a date and time. We also invite you to assist with crafts, story time, and other activities throughout the week!

Graduation

Each year we will have a formal graduation ceremony for our Pre K graduates of Moosey's Adventures in Learning. There will be extra fees involved.

Promotion/Transitions

Children promoting to the next class level will have a letter sent home introducing you to their new classroom along with your child's new teacher and daily schedule. Children graduating to kindergarten will receive diplomas. This is a very special time for all children! We will educate and encourage child with praise and happiness along with educational books, story time, and discussions for every age group that is promoting. We have materials and books available to help our families and children in making smooth transitions.

Fundraiser

We will have a large fundraiser at the beginning of each school year. We welcome and ask for your school spirit!!!! We will decide on a goal for our fundraiser each year (new computers, instruments, play equipment etc.). We will host small fundraisers throughout the year that will be noted on your school calendar!

Donations

If you have items you think the children here at Moosey's Adventures in Learning would benefit from, please feel free to donate them! We will happily accept your donations. Anything that we cannot use will be donated to a local charity or church!

Communication is Key in our Education Partnership
